The highlight of our 2017 was the graduation of 10 of our university students! This accomplishment can truly not be overstated. ## Programs and Impact

#### **Our Students**

First and foremost we exist to help our student girls achieve what they thought was impossible given their limited resources. While the number of student sponsorships will fluctuate throughout the year we are always striving to add more students and support those girls in most need as long as our funding permits.

- 44 students sponsored
- 10 university graduates

#### **Our Community Impact**

In 2017, the Círculo de Amigas Foundation (CDAF) reached thousands in the small city of Jinotega by working with various government organizations and outreach groups.

 4,960 total direct and indirect beneficiaries. These individuals include our sponsored students, participants of workshops, attendees of health clinics, visitors of our community library, hospital patients who received supplies from our student's community service projects, and more!

## **CDAF Programs**

#### **Tutoring**

In January of this year we had 13 girls that were at risk of losing their sponsorship because of poor grades. To meet their needs we placed a renewed effort into our tutoring program and the results paid off. Only two lost their sponsorship and one is repeating her year.

With a little personal attention, we realize the importance of our tutoring program and we are looking into be more effective across more subjects beyond the math and technical subjects.

To this end, we are thrilled to be offering a new level of sponsorship at \$20/month that will go directly into supporting this work among other career counseling and academic support systems. We feel that this level of sponsorship will enable millennials that are newly employed to afford monthly charitable participation.

#### **Lectures and Workshops**

In 2017, the Círculo de Amigas Foundation (CDAF) reached thousands in the small city of Jinotega by working with various government organizations and outreach groups.

- Our Students. Several lectures and workshops were given on our premises for the benefit of our students on a variety of topics including:
  - Teen Pregnancy. (University of Martin Lutero)
  - Sexually transmitted diseases and risk (Ministry of Health)
  - Women's health (Ministry of Health)
  - Child abuse (Jinotega Police Department)
  - Nutrition (Ministry of Health)
- Our Student Mothers. While student lectures are important, we also target mothers in some of our lecture series.
  - Domestic violence and abuse (*University Martin Lutero*)
  - Parental Communication skills with youth (CEPS- Managua)

Lectures and Workshops by Police, Ministry of Health and other groups.





## **Volunteering and Outreach**

Our students realize that they are the recipients of tremendous assistance from sponsors and donors. To promote of sense of "giving back", our in-country director initiated and managed two new programs, one in the community and another in-house.

#### **New Community Service Campaign**

CdAF's students collected supplies for over 120 patients and their families at Jinotega's public hospital. The first campaign of this kind, our students plan on organizing and performing this service at least twice a year.

## **In-House Volunteering**

Last March we initiated a program whereby the students would spend 1 hour per week helping to clean and maintain our facility. This simple task resulted in saving the organization 10 months of a full-time employee doing the same work or \$1,623. More than the savings, this simple act of keeping our facility tidy helps to instill a sense of ownership and pride in our center.

## **Fundraising and Repairs**

Our facility desperately needed a new retaining wall and interior work which was completed last summer. To defray costs, the families of the students helped with free labor and the girls raised money to help pay for supplies.







The success of Circulo de Amigas is beginning to show the fruits of personalized aid where one by one we are lifting girls out of poverty through education.

It is also important to realize that through education, the girls can become responsible and caring citizens that inspire the next generation of girls.




## **Financial Status**

#### Income


Donations and Sponsorships\*: \$78,934.80

<sup>\*\*</sup>Administrative costs in the U.S. include bank wire fees, Paypal fees, our initial incorporating startup expenses, web hosting and accounting fees.



Our revenues are still below what is required on a monthly basis to keep our facility open in Nicaragua. This includes the cost of paying our tutor, maintaining our library, paying utilities and the local staff. Individual large donations mid and late year helped us meet our payments to Nicaragua. The large expense in June was the cost of university graduation for several girls.
